JOINT STIPULATION AND ORDER REGARDING DATA SHARING
AMONG THE SETTLEMENT FACILITY-DOW CORNING TRUST,
THE MDL 926 CLAIMS OFFICE, AND THE CANADIAN CLAIMS FACILITIES

In conjunction with the Amended Joint Plan of Reorganization of Dow Corning Corporation, Dow Corning and Canadian class counsel agreed to separate class settlements in three provinces in Canada — Quebec (Class 6A), Ontario (Class 6B), and British Columbia (Class 6C). Each of these three class settlements is being administered by a claims administration facility in those provinces operated under the supervision of the respective provincial Canadian Courts.



The three Canadian claims facilities and the Settlement Facility-Dow Corning Trust ("SF-DCT") have a need to share claimant data to assure that claimants apply to and receive payment from the correct settlement class and claims facility and to assure appropriate quality control. The SF-DCT has obtained certain data and materials from the MDL 926 Claims Office that it seeks to share with the Canadian claims facilities, including data regarding specific claimants, "annotations" and claims-processing guidelines.


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that all data and materials that the SF-DCT has obtained and obtains in the future from the MDL 926 Claims Office may be shared with and provided to the claims administrators for the three Canadian facilities. The claims administrators for the three Canadian claims facilities shall maintain the confidentiality of those materials and data and may only use such information in connection with processing claims and may only provide such data to the staff of their respective claims facilities, except that the facilities may provide to an individual claimant a copy of that claimant's own records.

The Debtor's Representatives and the Claimants' Advisory Committee are in the process of obtaining orders from the Canadian Courts authorizing the Canadian claims facilities to share information with the SF-DCT. Additional orders will be sought from the Canadian Courts to clarify and provide that the Canadian claims facilities shall be authorized to share information with the MDL 926 Claims Office.




